Housing supply rises

Good news for buyers who have been watching and waiting: More houses are on the market.

The market is showing signs of increased supply and a potential cooling of prices. In other words, you may have more to choose from and better deals.

National inventory grew 4 percent year -over-year in April, while inventory in large markets grew 10 percent, according to a Realtor.com report. Much of that appears to be existing homes, as new construction figures were down this spring as compared to 2018.

In fact, the supply trend started in 2018 and carried over into 2019. The reasons are varied but could be due in part to a series of interest rate hikes that in turn affected mortgage rates (which are hovering near 4.5 percent) as well as factors like tariffs (which affect construction).

Increased supply is seen mainly in the median ranges to higher price points. So buyers looking for something a bit more affordable may still be battling some competition.

What do you call that pretty firework?

Cake. Chrysanthemum. Waterfall. If you've ever wondered what to call the different types of fireworks you see during a professional show, other than "that cool one that trailed off," you've come to the right place -- and can impress (or annoy) your friends afterward.

Here's a sampling of official fireworks terminology from the American Pyrotechnics Association:

* Cake: A cluster of small tubes, linked by fuse, that fire small aerial effects at a rapid pace. They are often used in large quantities as part of a show's finale.

* Chrysanthemum: A spherical break of colored stars that leave a visible trail of sparks.

* Falling Leaves: Stars that twinkle and flutter down.

* Fish: Large inserts that propel themselves rapidly away from the shell burst, often looking like a fish swimming away.

* Palm Tree: Rising comet (trunk) that bursts into six large trailing stars (fronds) and can also have small reports (coconuts).

* Peony: The most commonly seen shell type, with a spherical break of colored stars.

* Waterfall: Named for the shape of its break, this shell features heavy long-burning tailed stars that only travel a short distance from the shell burst before free-falling to the ground. They sometimes include a glittering through the "waterfall."



Tenderize a bee sting?

To minimize pain of a bee sting: try meat tenderizer. Make a paste of one part unseasoned meat tenderizer to four parts water, and coat the area. Tenderizer contains papain, an enzyme found in papayas. It supposedly breaks down proteins that cause pain and itching. If nothing else, a cool paste can help with the hot spot left behind by a sting.

Should I co-sign my child's mortgage?

As a parent, you would do anything for your child. But co-signing a mortgage is a major business decision, not just a family plan.

Try to take the child out of the equation and think of the child as a borrower.

There are advantages for the borrower if you co-sign. The borrower may qualify for a loan he or she wouldn't otherwise get, whether it's a larger amount or a better rate. Many people have legitimate reasons to seek out a co-signer, including those with the cash to pay the monthly payment but not much credit history. Many self-employed folks also can't prove a steady source of income.

Ideally, the borrower would refinance to a loan in their own name after a while. If you are confident that the borrower has the ability to pay and can be counted on to pay on time, this could be a good option. Make a written agreement with the borrower as to when he or she will refinance, and what happens if the mortgage payment is not made. Then, should stick to the agreement. Risks

* You are a joint applicant for the loan with all the implications of taking a mortgage. A late payment is a penalty against you, not just the other borrower.

Dog Fear Week: The Fourth of July brings canine terrors

Dogs love a party, but Fourth of July isn't usually a favorite fiesta.

While some dogs are okay with fireworks, others have an extreme fear. If yours is one of them, take time before the Dog Fear Week starts to keep the pooch safe.

First, make sure the dog has a collar with up-to-date information.

It's a good idea to have an up-to-date picture of the dog and identifying features. For those who find dogs, especially expensive dogs, make sure owners can show a picture.

During the week of the 4th, try to keep the dog exercised to keep energy down.

When it is time for fireworks, keep your dog inside with soft music playing and the curtains closed.

Grilling corn on the cob

Here is the secret to perfectly grilling corn. Pull the husks back but don't remove. Strip away silk strands. Next, fill a large pot with cold water and add a couple of tablespoons of salt to soak your corn in for about 10-15 minutes. With the grill set to medium, cook in the husks, for about 15-20 minutes, turning every five minutes. Once tender, pull the husk off and butter. Secret seasoning: Use a 3to-1 ratio salt to sugar just before serving.



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Homemade sunscreens versus commercial

All over social media this summer (as last), homemade sunscreens are being promoted by friends and family.

Here's the good news: they do work. The bad news? They don't work much.

Researchers at the Center for Injury Research and Policy at Nationwide Children's Hospital and the Brooks College of Health at University of North Florida concluded that most homemade sunblock recipes on Pinterest make unsubstantiated claims about their efficacy. The study was published in May 2019.

Researchers sampled every fifth pin to collect 189 relevant pins. Of those,

68.3 percent used ingredients that offered low UV radiation protection. Meanwhile, a third of the pins made SPF claims ranging from SPF 2 to SPF 50.

Sunscreens involving coconut oil, shea butter, lavender oil, essential oils, and other ingredients provide an SPF range of 1 to 7 — despite claims of higher protection.

You can find an FDA-approved sunscreen in store or online to meet your needs whether it's traditional or labeled as natural. The American Academy of Dermatology recommends SPF 30 or above.
